<p>Sing the rhyme "Hickory Dickory Dock" Have ago at copying the sign language to go with it. Ask a grown up to record you and send it to us. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t2-dc-112-bsl-sign-supported-hickory-dickory-dock-nursery-rhyme-video</p>	<p>Create your own clock using things from around your house e.g. old boxes, bottles and cardboard tubes. Send us a picture of your creation.</p>	<p>How many clocks can you find around your house? What other things can you find that tell the time? Draw some of them.</p>
<p>Play "Simon Says". Use the words (positional language) up, down, behind, in front of, next to, in between, underneath. Practice any you are not sure of.</p>	<p>Draw a clock like the one in the rhyme and ask your grown up to help you write the numbers. How many numbers do you recognise? Can you write any of them? Which one tells you how old you are? Practice the numbers you don't know alongside our weekly activities.</p>	<p>See if you can get dressed by yourself and get your grown up to time how long it takes. If this is too tricky try putting your pyjamas on at the end of the day instead. See if you can get quicker at dressing by the end of the week. Let us know how you get on.</p>
<p>Make a shape mouse. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-l-52713-hickory-dickory-dock-mouse-craft-activity</p>	<p>Put the pictures in order according to the rhyme. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-t-1747-hickory-dickory-dock-sequencing-4-per-a4</p>	<p>Beat the clock. E.g. see how many jumps you can do whilst your grown up times 10 seconds. See if you can tidy up before your favourite song finishes etc.</p>
<p>Draw/make 3 mice, making sure that all of their tails are different lengths. Now talk about which mouse has the longest tail, which one has the shortest tail and then put them in order.</p>	<p>Find 3 things that are longer than your pencil and 3 things that are shorter.
