



<p><u>What the Ladybird Heard</u> <u>challenge grid</u> 18th-22nd May</p> 	<p>Listen to the story of 'What the Ladybird heard' on the internet. Which animal is your favourite?</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Eu9mPX7DuLA</p>	<p>Listen to the song performed by Julia Donaldson of What the Ladybird Heard.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7NbyiDpY6Ww</p>	<p>Can you make a 'wanted poster' for either Hefty Hugh or Lanky Len? I have attached an example you can either print out or copy.</p>
<p>Have a go at making some red playdough (I have attached a recipe). Can you make some ladybirds using the playdough?</p>	<p>Can you decorate a biscuit or cake to look like a ladybird? How many spots does your ladybird have altogether?</p> 	<p>Have a go at making a ladybird hat. Maybe you could retell the story wearing your hat or even go on a minibeast hunt to look for ladybirds or other bugs in your garden?</p>	<p>Have a go at some of the doubling challenges attached. What is double 2? Double 6?</p>
<p>Design your own farmyard making labels for all the different animals on the farm.</p>	<p>Draw a ladybird and find some small things to use as spots e.g. buttons or pasta. Each ladybird must have the same number of spots on each side. How many different doubles can you make?</p>	<p>Can you make a map of the farm? Talk about what is next to each building on the farm. Now can you plan a route through your farm map to get to the cow making turns, next to, beside.</p>	<p>Draw, paint, or make your favourite animal from the story. Write a simple sentence to tell me about your work e.g. I love cats or I have made a cow.</p>

This week's challenge grid is slightly different as it is just focusing on the story of What the Ladybird Heard by Julia Donaldson but if you can, please supplement with some phonics (Mr Mc phonics on YouTube is really good still) and reading.
