How many words can you think of with this sound?</p> <p>Write some silly sentences using these words.</p> <p>*Again, choose a sound from your learning pack.</p> <p>Repeat activity with different sounds.</p>	<p>Reading Comprehension Read another story with animals as characters. Discuss the story and the events.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pick 6 main events in the story. Make a grid with 6 spaces/ boxes. Draw a picture in each box to show the sequence of the story. - Write a sentence to match each picture. Be sure to include the beginning, middle and end.
<p>Maths Measuring – How wide is your bedroom?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Measure it using your hands, feet, socks and with a tape measure (if you have one). - Make a chart to record the different measurements. - Which method of measuring worked best? Why did you think it was best? 	<p>Science Think about your own ‘habitat’ (where you live).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Draw a diagram of your habitat, labelling each room. - Can you think about why you need each room? E.g. bathroom, kitchen. - What are the things you need so that you can stay safe and be healthy? 	<p>Science & Art Draw a portrait of your family pet. If you don’t have a pet, think about a pet you would like to have. Think carefully about the structure of the animal. Label the body parts, using your science words.</p>
<p>Maths Measuring – Who has the longest foot in your family? Who has the shortest foot? Choose an object to help you measure to find out. Can you write the measurements in order, starting with the smallest? Use materials of your choice e.g. plasticine, dough, lego, or scrap materials in your home (cardboard boxes etc). 	<p>Music Listen to a different family member’s favourite piece of music. Can you clap along with the rhythm? (beat). Does it have a fast or slow rhythm? Try humming the melody. Does it have any words? How does the music make you feel? Can you make up a dance for the piece of music?</p>
