E.g. The Scary swordfish.
<p>Maths – Secret Numbers Write the numbers 0 to 20 on paper. Secretly choose one and ask a grown up to ask some questions to find out your secret number. E.g. Is it less than 10? Is it between 10 and 20? Is it odd? Is it greater than 15? Once the number is guessed, swap roles and repeat.</p> <p><i>Challenge by using numbers up to 100.</i></p>	<p>Science Think carefully about 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. In the story the characters are the Mr and Mrs Grinling, the cat and the seagull. Can you draw a picture of each of their habitats? Also, write a sentence to match to describe the habitat.</p>	<p>Science Have a walk at the beach, the park, or the woods. Which micro-habitats can you find? Can you find any living things in the micro-habitat?</p> <p>*Micro-habitats are smaller habitats within a larger habitat. E.g. under a log, in a rock pool.</p>
<p>Spelling Continue to practise reading and spelling the year 1 common exception words. These are listed along with the phonics words in the spelling grids (in your home learning pack). Make 3 sets of number cards 0 – 10.</p> <p>Play Go Fish to add numbers to 10. E.g. you have fished a 4 (when choosing a card), what number do you need to make 10? The winner is the first person to find all pairs that add to 10.</p>	<p>Music – Sea Shanties As our topic is 'All at Sea', we will be learning to sing some Sea Shanties.
