

Autumn 1 -Ourselves and Harvest celebrations

Key Texts: Elmer, The Enormous Turnip





Why this? Why now?

We will firstly settle into Reception, exploring our new areas and becoming familiar with staff and other children. Whilst we settle and learn new routines, a baseline will be completed.

We will then start to learn about Elmer the patchwork elephant and celebrate how we are all unique exploring our similarities and differences. We will learn about different colours and find out facts about elephants. We will find out about which continents elephants live in and how they are different to our own. We will finish with a colourful elephant parade and Elmer party. We will then move onto exploring the season of Autumn and learning about Harvest. We will visit a Church and help to prepare our own Harvest meal together. We will then finish the half term learning about the Hindu festival, Diwali.

Key Vocabulary –

Unique, similarities, differences, elephants, world, atlas, continent, Africa, Asia, names of colours, Harvest, celebrations, thankful, Autumn, seasons, Diwali, festival of light, Hindu, temple.

These are some of the opportunities that will offered for the children. Some of these opportunities will be taught as a focused teaching activity and others offered through continuous provision, both inside and outside. We will be responding to child-led interests to lead our learning further and also respond to spontaneous learning opportunities.

Area of Learning and Development – Communication and Language


- Listen to longer stories and recall much of what happens and listen in a range of situations.

 Talk about members of their immediate family and community. Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways. Recognise some similarities and differences between this country and life in other countries. Draw information from a simple map. 	 Talk about similarities and differences and celebrate how we are all unique. Talk about who is in our family and share information and photos. Think about how the children have changed since they were a baby. Learn about how Harvest is celebrated and how Christians celebrate Harvest in Church. Think about which food can be prepared for a Harvest meal and work together to make the food.
